

Dear Parishioners,

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten Season. This coming Wednesday, we invite the faithful to receive the ashes on your foreheads. The minister of the ashes has the choice to say either, “Remember you are dust, and unto dust you shall return,” or “Repent and believe in the Gospel.” These two profound sentences place in in right relationship with God.

Without the hope of eternal life, which only Jesus can give us, we are reduced to mere mortal, temporal beings. It is a matter of time before we wither and die, our bodies return to the basic elements of the earth, and even the memory that we ever existed fades away. In the long run, the sun will devour the world and even the greatest memorials will be no more. We are dust, and unto dust we shall return. But, with Christ, we are given a promise of life eternal. We can become immortal, as He is immortal. We can live in the presence of God in paradise. Without Jesus, all is lost. In our Lord is our hope, the only hope we could ever have. How essential and right it is to glorify God for this great, eternal gift?!!

During Lent, we reflect on the priorities of our lives. We may have some spoken priorities, but an analysis of the way we live our lives may reveal that we place other, less important things first. Sometimes we follow our fears, our temporary pleasures, our anger, our selfishness, or our self-righteousness. We have become too comfortable blaming others and our circumstances rather than accepting our responsibility to become the people we want to be. We want to be good, holy, contribute to humanity, people of integrity, people of principle. Yet, we have followed the path of superficiality and mindlessness. It is time to Repent and believe in the Gospel. Jesus’ teachings are not just one of many wise lessons. It is the Truth that leads to true happiness and the meaning of our existence.

May the outward sign of ashes on our foreheads ritualize a deeper conversion of heart. May God bless us as we sacrifice, pray, and offer charity together in this season of repentance. May the fruit of our efforts be a holier and more focused people of God.

What is a Taize prayer service?

The Taizé community is an ecumenical monastic order with a strong devotion to peace and justice through prayer and meditation. The 100-strong community of Roman Catholic and Protestant monks is drawn from 30 countries across the world. It was founded in 1940 by Roger Louis Schutz-Marsauche (known as 'Brother Roger'). Taizé has spawned a unique style of worship that has become popular in churches, retreat centers and seminaries throughout the world. The singing of distinctive and much-repeated prayer chants during candlelit prayer services is one of its trademarks. Taizé music highlights simple phrases, usually lines from the Psalms or other pieces of scripture, repeated or sung in canon. The repetition is designed to help meditation and prayer.

If you would like to be a part of the Taize choir we invite you to join us! We will be having a few rehearsals closer to the date. The songs are simple chants relatively easy to learn.

Feminine Genius Lenten Book Study


What if you could have been a witness to the events of the last days of Jesus' life—walking with him as he entered Jerusalem, observing his crucifixion, and embracing him on Easter?

Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own? How can you say to your brother, 'Brother, let me remove that splinter in your eye,' when you do not even notice the wooden beam in your eye? You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye. "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit. For people do not pick figs from thornbushes, nor do they gather grapes from brambles. A good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good, but an evil person out of a store of evil produces evil; for from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks."

The Creed
