

#### Dear Parishioners,

This is Divine Mercy Sunday. Jesus appeared to St. Faustina from Poland in 1930's. The famous image of



"Jesus, I trust in you," with the red and blue rays of light coming forth from the heart of Jesus is associated with this vision.

St. Faustina was a religious sister. Because of her intense prayer life and witnessing to the visions of Christ, her sanity was called into question. After a thorough evaluation of her mental health, she was recognized as being authentic in her testimony.

Following the instructions of Jesus with prudent discernment with her spiritual director, St. Faustina promoted the image of the Divine Mercy and the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy. Jesus promised that he would supply whatever she was lacking to accomplish this endeavor.

St. Faustina died just prior to World War II. The atrocities of the Holocaust and the casualties of the battle fields caused many to question the plan of God. The devotion to the Divine Mercy reminded many that the Lord will never abandon humanity to the consequences of our wickedness. Jesus has been and continues to intervene in history to snatch us away from the grasp of the Evil One.

As we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, may we renew our trust in Jesus. May we experience a personal encounter with the Risen Lord, especially during the trials that life presents to us fragile and vulnerable children. May we renew our commitment in the face of the challenges of our days to give witness to God's unconquerable love.





When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.
